What is an Administrator's Breakfast?

Greater Dane County Talented and Gifted Network offers this breakfast every three years. The event includes a breakfast buffet, a guest speaker and a round table discussion featuring middle school students from Greater Dane County school districts discussing how advanced learning/gifted programming works in their home districts and how programming is benefiting them.

Who should a Coordinator invite?

Every Gifted and Talented/Advanced Learning Coordinator may invite their own administrators, school board members and/or other district personnel who would benefit from hearing students from a variety of districts talk about advanced learning/gifted and talented programming from a personal perspective. The discussions are in a round table format.

Which students should attend? All districts have the opportunity to invite **4 students that are current 7th-9th graders** to come, have breakfast with us and then answer questions from district administrators/guests in small round table discussions. Every few minutes, the **students will travel from table to table sharing experiences about how their learning needs are being met in creative ways in their school.** Students should be comfortable with speaking to adult groups and be familiar with their personal gifted services.

Why should your district attend? Students will share a wide variety of experiences with advanced learning/gifted programming and will share perspectives about what practices/services best meet their individual needs.

What is the cost of attending? Costs are determined annually to cover basic expenses of the breakfast. Current cost is \$15/person. A district is responsible for all attendees—students, administrators, teachers, etc.
