I had hoped to be with you tomorrow at the GDCALN meeting, but I have to go out of state to handle a family issue. I have attached the two most recent WATG e-news articles related to the state budget and to gifted advocacy. I hope that you will be able to use the WATG announcement portion of the meeting to have a discussion on WHAT YOU WANT TO SEE for gifted education in Wisconsin in the future, and then let WATG know your thoughts at advocacy@watg.org.

WATG's initial priority is related to the DPI grant funding in the 2019-2021 state budget. Next, however, they will be forming strategy for major policy shifts in how gifted education is done in WI, most likely including removing barriers to acceleration, better reporting and accountability, and coming up with funding that is more based on per-pupil aid rather than just competitive grants.
